As part of Metropolitan Land Group's ongoing planning and due diligence related to its Sherwood community land holdings west of Hwy 99 near the new high school, we conducted public opinion research from February 6-11, 2021 to measure public attitudes about the future of the community. We completed 181 interviews among likely voters. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 7.00%


VOTERS WANT TO SEE A NEW RESIDENTIAL NEIGHBORHOOD DEVELOPED AROUND THE NEW SHERWOOD HIGH SCHOOL

Overall, Sherwood residents strongly prefer the development of new residential neighborhoods and housing over businesses and offices. Specifically, they favor a new, carefully planned neighborhood on the land near and around the new Sherwood High School. Residents believe the city council should move forward this year to bring land near the high school inside the city limits and urban growth boundary so it can be planned and developed over the next 15-20 years.

By a 2-1 margin, residents have a favorable opinion of the city council and, importantly, those who have a favorable opinion of the council are more likely to support moving forward to create a new neighborhood around the high school. Finally, residents strongly believe that a new residential neighborhood around the high school will generate tax revenues to support schools and local services and that the area will be carefully planned and slowly built over 15-20 years.



VOTERS SUPPORT EXPANDING THE CITY WEST OF HWY 99 TO ALLOW DEVELOPMENT OF LANDS AROUND THE NEW SHERWOOD HIGH SCHOOL

The Sherwood city council is considering a proposal to expand the city limits to include undeveloped land west of Hwy 99 around the new Sherwood High School. This decision will allow for planning and gradual development of the area over the next 15-20 years. The city has already spent several years and substantial tax dollars on this project. Final approval will require both the Sherwood city council and Metro regional government to approve bringing these lands inside the urban growth boundary.

Given what you've heard, do you support or oppose the city council moving ahead with this proposal for future development?



VOTERS SUPPORT CREATING MORE HOUSING OVER LIMITS ON FUTURE GROWTH


In thinking about the future of Sherwood, which comes closest to your opinion?

- In the planning for future, Sherwood should prioritize creating jobs with more construction of office buildings, business districts and industrial manufacturing buildings.






Which of the following comes closest to your opinion about the future of the undeveloped land west of Hwy 99 around the new Sherwood high school?

- · Sherwood is growing too fast and should leave the area undeveloped -- even if that means there is no neighborhood around the new high school for many years to come.





VOTERS WANT A RESIDENTIAL NEIGHBORHOOD AROUND THE NEW HIGH SCHOOL

And if you had to choose between just the business and residential development, which would be your choice?






In thinking of possible improvements and amenities on the undeveloped land around the new high school, which of the following is most needed?

In thinking of the possible benefits of creating a new residential area on land around the new high school, which of the following is most important?


- Strengthening the local tax base to fund schools and city services
